

A Fall Yard and Garden Check List:

Completed

Mow your grass until it stops growing.

Tall grass gets matted under the snow, encouraging growth of snow mold.

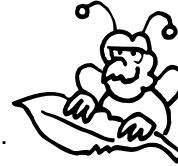


Clear your gardens of debris and garden litter.

Insect eggs, fungi, and plant diseases can overwinter in dead plants and leaves.

Turn the soil in food and flower gardens.

It helps debris decompose quickly so pests and disease cannot survive.

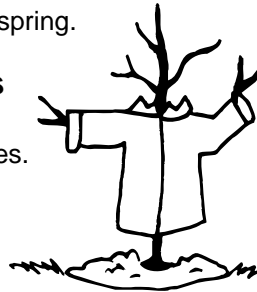


Remove weeds in late autumn and early winter.

A single weed pulled now can prevent hundreds of sprouting weeds in spring.

Prepare trees and shrubs for winter conditions.

Remove dead twigs and branches. Mulch around trees. Fence and wrap as needed.
