**Common Drought-Tolerant Plants...**

- Pimpernel
- Geranium
- Marigold
- Petunia
- Dusty Miller
- Verbena
- Indigo
- Daylily
- Poppy

**Trees and Shrubs...**

- Box Elder
- Black Locust
- Sassafras
- Flowering Quince
- Gray Dogwood
- Witch Hazel
- Juniper
- Bayberry

**Keep the area clear of weeds.**

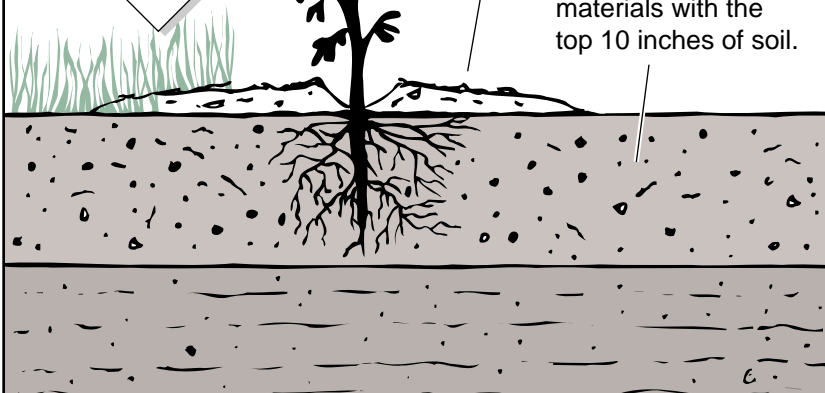
Weeds may consume more water than your plants do.

**Apply mulch 3 to 4 inches deep.**

Mulch controls weeds and helps your plants and soil retain water.

**Help your soil absorb water.**

Mix peat, compost, or other organic materials with the top 10 inches of soil.
