

Selective Pruning vs. Topping Trees

Select limbs to be removed.

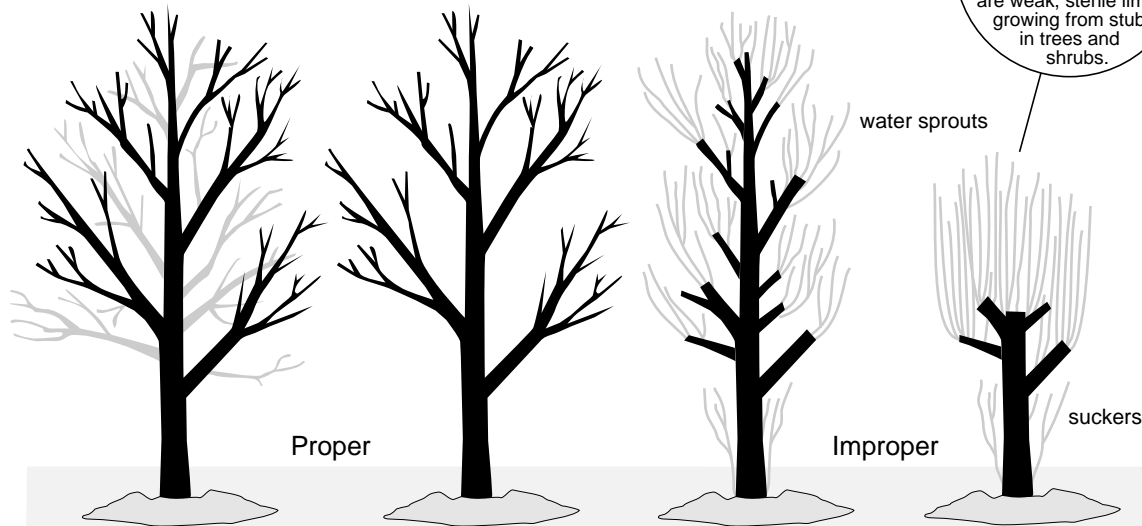
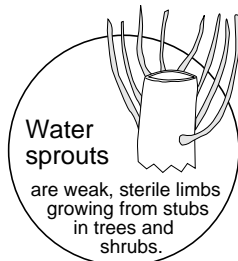
Thinning-out pruning helps trees maintain a natural shape.

Even proper pruning can stress trees.

Tree-wound dressing is not recommended or needed on any pruning cut or wound.

Avoid "topping" your trees.

It usually causes growth of "suckers" and "water sprouts".
