

**Penn State Pointers ► Control Broadleaf Weeds in Late Summer and Fall**

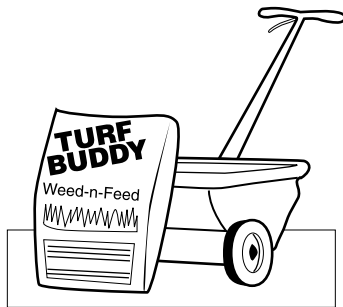
**Common broadleaf weeds include dandelions, clover, knotweed and ground ivy.**

**The best single control for these weeds is keeping your lawn adequately fertilized.**

Establishing and maintaining a dense turf stops them from gaining a foothold.

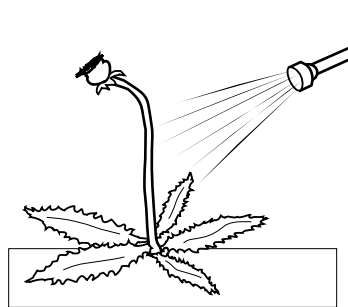
**If weeds become a problem, you may need a combination of the three methods below...**

**'Weed-and-Feed'  
Applications**



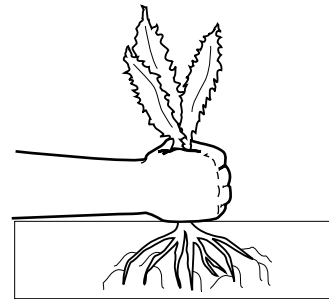
A product that combines broadleaf herbicide to eliminate weeds and fertilizer for denser turf.

**Liquid Herbicide  
Applications**



Very effective in small areas. Herbicide sprays eliminate weeds, but must be used with care.

**Manually Pulling or  
Digging Out Weeds**



Most effective when done before weeds go to seed. Pulled weeds may grow again from remaining roots.

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**For Late Summer and Fall/September Time Frame**
