

Penn State Pointers ► Control Broadleaf Weeds in Late Summer and Fall

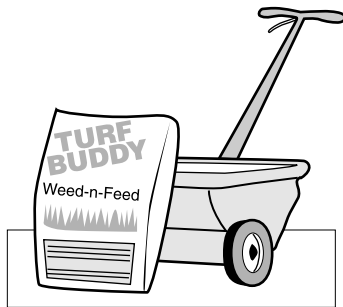
Common broadleaf weeds include dandelions, clover, knotweed and ground ivy.

The best single control for these weeds is keeping your lawn adequately fertilized.

Establishing and maintaining a dense turf stops them from gaining a foothold.

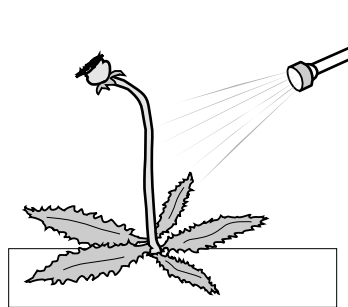
If weeds become a problem, you may need a combination of the three methods below...

**'Weed-and-Feed'
Applications**



A product that combines broadleaf herbicide to eliminate weeds and fertilizer for denser turf.

**Liquid Herbicide
Applications**



Very effective in small areas. Herbicide sprays eliminate weeds, but must be used with care.

**Manually Pulling or
Digging Out Weeds**



Most effective when done before weeds go to seed. Pulled weeds may grow again from remaining roots.
